

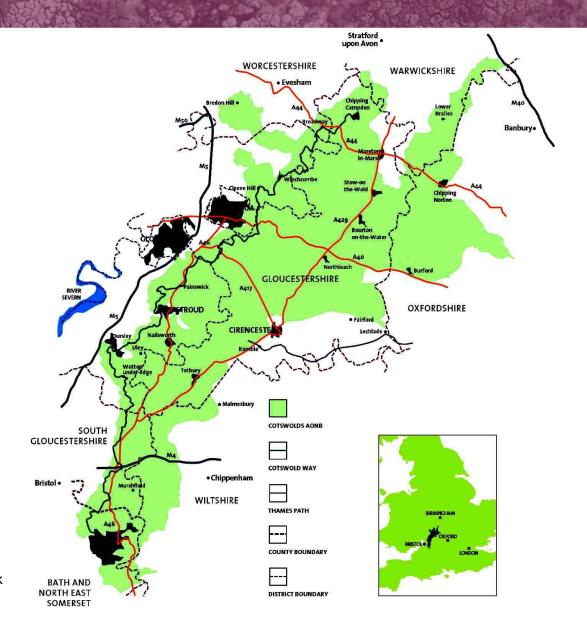

The 890 km long Bruce Trail is Canada's oldest and longest marked footpath and is maintained by volunteers. The trail spans beautiful and varied landscapes as it passes through Canada's most densely populated region, and is the only continuous public access to the Niagara Escarpment, a UNESCO World Biosphere Reserve.
